FACE COVERING MANDATORY

Face covering is required in public indoor spaces. This includes also religious indoor celebrations. Exempt from this new by-law are persons with medical conditions as well as the celebrant and reader during the Holy Mass who maintain distance from the rest of the congregation.

It will be celebrated every Wednesday with the residents and staff only, (without the public) to ensure safety protocols. There will be no Holy Mass on Wednesdays in the church. The Mass intention will be celebrated as booked.

PRAYER FOR PARISHIONERS WHO DIED DURING THE SHUTDOWN. Parish Bereavement Ministry.

“Because of the restrictions during the months of the pandemic shutdown, those who died did not have the prayerful support of a funeral Mass. And those who mourned did not have the consolation of the prayers of the faith community. In addition to the Masses you will be offering in your parishes for your parishioners who died during those long months, I am asking that a Holy Mass to be celebrated in every Parish in the Diocese on **Saturday, October 10th, at 11 a.m.** for all who died throughout the Diocese of Hamilton during the shutdown — whether from the COVID-19 virus or any other cause.” - Douglas Crosby, OMI Bishop of Hamilton

This Holy Mass will be celebrated at Saint Mary’s without public attendance to ensure the safety guidelines. Please join spiritually! Individual Memorial Holy Masses for parishioners who died during the shutdown will be celebrated on Tuesdays in the coming weeks, please check the Mass schedule in the bulletin. Those Masses will replace the annual Bereavement Holy Mass this year.

ONE SPECIAL COLLECTION!

“Several Special Collections were missed during the shutdown. We have received letters from the beneficiaries of many of these Special Collections asking us to consider holding Special Collections in the Autumn. To respond in a helpful way to support their important works and in a way that does not overburden parishioners, we will permit ONE SPECIAL COLLECTION on the weekend of October 17-18, 2020, to accommodate all Special Collections — those missed and those normally scheduled for the Autumn.
