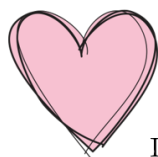

REGULAR OFFICE HOURS

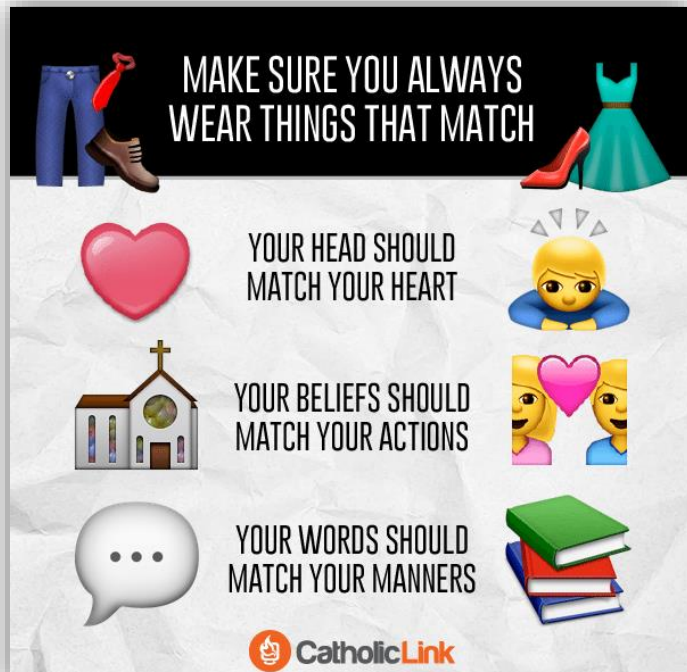

Hello Parishes of the Diocese of Hamilton,

Here at Camp Brébeuf we normally see thousands of youth of every month. Since March we have faced closures of most of our programs. Our normal day camp that welcomes over 600 children was only able to hold 150 this summer with the new safety regulations. Our overnight camp, OE programs, and youth ministry initiatives have all been paused.

We have been working hard to start up new, safe programs for our communities. Without the support of others though we have had to come to the realization that we may not make it to our 80th summer at all.

Mount Hope is located only 20 minutes from downtown Hamilton, on the Rockwood, 15 minutes east of Guelph, on the banks of the shores of Lake Niapenco.

PRAYER FOR PARISHIONERS WHO DIED DURING THE SHUTDOWN. Parish Bereavement Ministry.

“Because of the restrictions during the months of the pandemic shutdown, those who died did not have the prayerful support of a funeral Mass. And those who mourned did not have the consolation of the prayers of the faith community. In addition to the Masses you will be offering in your parishes for your parishioners who died during those long months, I am asking that a Holy Mass to be celebrated in every Parish in the Diocese on **Saturday, October 10th, at 11 a.m.** for all who died throughout the Diocese of Hamilton during the shutdown — whether from the COVID-19 virus or any other cause.” - Douglas Crosby, OMI Bishop of Hamilton

This Holy Mass will be celebrated at Saint Mary’s without public attendance to ensure the safety guidelines. Please join spiritually! Individual Memorial Holy Masses for parishioners who died during the shutdown will be celebrated on Tuesdays in the coming weeks, please check the Mass schedule in the bulletin. These Masses will replace the Bereavement Holy Mass this year.

ONE ‘SPECIAL’ COLLECTION!

“Several Special Collections were missed during the shutdown. We have received letters from the beneficiaries of many of these Special Collections asking us to consider holding Special Collections in the Autumn. To respond in a helpful way to support their important works and in a way that does not overburden parishioners, we will permit ONE SPECIAL COLLECTION on the weekend of October 17-18, 2020, to accommodate all Special Collections — those missed and those normally scheduled for the Autumn. The funds collected will be divided according to percentages established by the results of last year’s Special Collections. The charities that will benefit are: Share Lent, Pope’s Pastoral Works, Holy Land (Good Friday) Cura Pastorum Association, Needs of the Church in Canada World Mission Sunday. A special envelope will be printed for distribution on THANKSGIVING WEEKEND, the weekend PRIOR TO the Special Collection weekend.” Douglas Crosby, OMI Bishop of Hamilton

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FOR ADULTS AND MINORS

We will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in January 2021, date to be determined. It will be celebrated without the Bishop this time and by the local Pastor and outside the Holy Mass with safety guidelines in place. We will open registration in November 2020.

We hope to have First Holy Communion celebrated following Easter, at individual Masses every week. We will provide registration opportunities and more details in the new year.

We cannot offer in-person preparation at this time. We rely on the schools’ involvement, based on the curriculum programs, and home schooling. We will try to reach out to the schools and candidates via Internet with some suggestions.

As we are not present in schools with pastoral ministry, school Masses, and confessions are suspended for the time being.

RCIA program for adults, registration is open. We will suspend in-person preparation sessions until the candidates and our ministers are comfortable. Meanwhile, we will provide guidelines for self study.

We can recommend attending Sunday Holy Mass as the best way of preparation in every case. You can be assured that we observe safety protocols in our churches.
